AgriLife Extension Introduces new Extension Agent for Disaster Assessment & Recovery (DAR)

Linda M. Wasserman

DAR agents are a resource for County Extension staff in providing community disaster-preparedness education, animal-related disaster response, and projects related to short-and long-term recovery. DAR Teams may also be deployed to support response efforts across the state when requested. After a disaster event, DAR agents may help local jurisdictions in completing disaster summary outlines and preliminary damage assessments. With training, DAR agents will be available to support communities in navigating the state and federal recovery process. The DAR unit will also work with the Texas Department of Emergency Management (TDEM) to strengthen Texas' state response to hazardous events, support faster local government recovery, and the return of individuals, families and communities to a new norm after disaster. Linda's assigned counties consist of Brooks, Cameron, Hidalgo, Jim Hogg, Kenedy/Kleberg, Starr, Willacy and Zapata.


