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HIGHLIGHT PROGRAM O F THE QUARTER **RGV Beef 706 Program** County Extension Agent: Vidal Saenz

The RGV Beef 706 Program is a 3-part series of hands-on sessions focusing on beef quality management and marketing opportunities and is available for beef cattle producers from Hidalgo County and surrounding counties. This program is designed to help producers improve their profitability and have a better understanding of the production process after their cattle enter the feed yard. The 3 sessions covered factors affecting feeder calf value and prices, evaluating market steers for carcass quality and yield grades, and a full day exercise on the fabrication of a beef carcass. 

RGV Beef 706 Program

RGV agriculture agents held the second session of the RGV Beef 706 program at Rio Beef Yard. Over **40 participants** discussed feed yard performance of cattle and AgriLife specialists evaluated the market steers in the program and consumer preferences of meat quality.

2022 Hidalgo County Grain Sorghum Variety Trial

Six grain sorghum varieties were harvested at the Kotzur farm in Hargill. The results of the trial will be emailed to local farmers and presented at the Cotton & Grain Pre-Plant Conference in January 2023. Special thanks to Pioneer Hi-Bred seed for harvesting assistance during this trial.

Texas Vegetable Growers RGV Summit

Texas A&M AgriLife hosted the vegetable growers summit to discuss legislative updates, ag labor, water, updates on new seeds, chemicals and products for the next growing season. The **45 participants** also received updates on cover crops and variety improvements.

2022 Hidalgo County Cotton Variety Trial

At the McCutcheon's farm in Mercedes, **10 cotton varieties** were harvested in the Hidalgo County Cotton Variety Trial. The cotton was weighed and transferred to a module builder. Results of the trial will be interpreted to the row crop growers and at the Cotton & Grain Pre-Plant Conference in January 2023.

Master Gardener Workshops

Gardening

While the gardens get plenty of sun during the summer months, those months are prime preparation time! **20** teachers and principals participated in a virtual Teacher Training while **35** teachers from Mims Elementary attended the in person training. Over **1,200 cool season vegetable seedlings** were grown to distribute to the school gardens. The adult gardening program has **78 participants** and 6 schools and 2 learning centers have over **450 youth participants** in the youth gardening program.

Nutrition

Sanchez Public Library in Weslaco (**9** participants) to offer the Choose Healthy Program and a MyPlate presentation.
