County Extension Agent: Ashley Gregory


The Hidalgo County Master Gardener program has been a staple Extension program in Hidalgo County for many years. There are currently 80 Master Gardeners in Hidalgo County that teach the community on multiple gardening topics such as rainwater harvesting, composting, and vegetable gardening! In 2022, the Master Gardeners volunteered 3,295 hours valued at \$89,624! They have completed 2022 with 32 workshops and events with over 600 participants. Our Master Gardeners work rain or shine to upkeep their Educational Garden in Precinct 2 to provide a peaceful and beautiful experience to all that visit the garden. Ashley Gregory, County Extension Agent-Horticulture, manages and guides the Master Gardeners through their training, internship, and volunteer hours with her expertise and dedication to the program.

Nearly half of adults have hypertension or high blood pressure (CDC.gov). For Heart Health month (February), the McAllen Public Library hosted a Cooking Well for Healthy Blood Pressure. 18 graduates and over 60 people total enjoyed heart healthy recipes and learned how to manage their blood pressure. Dr. Valdez partnered with South Texas Health System and South Texas College to provide a Mental Health First Aid training to 12 STC staff. Mental Health First Aid is a course that teaches you how to identify, understand and respond to signs of mental illnesses and substance use disorders. The training gives you the skills you need to reach out and provide initial help and support to someone who may be developing a mental health or substance use problem or experiencing a crisis. The First Annual Heart Strong Multi-County Conference was held to highlight February as Heart Month. Over 90 participants took part in a health fair, a food demonstration, and presentations from DHR health care professionals to help them make meaningful progress toward their cardiovascular goals. Twenty (20) participants were walking into Heart health month with the Walk Across Texas program! With their 832- mile goal of walking across Texas, the walkers logged 3,525.83 miles!

29th Annual Rio Grande Valley Cotton and Grain Pre-Plant Conference

The Annual Pre-plant conference was held at Rio Farms in Monte Alto. There were **146 program participants** that were educated on TDA laws and regulations, the importance of exports, grain crop market outlook the cotton crop outlook and new developments from industry. STAR Livestock Show

The South Texas Agricultural Roundup took place at the Rio Grande Valley Livestock Showgrounds in Mercedes, Texas from February 1st through February 3rd, 2023. The livestock show was a success. Several exhibitors placed with their projects. This was a great opportunity for the exhibitors and their families to hear from the livestock judges to prepare for the upcoming Rio Grande Livestock Show that took place in March 2023.

25th Annual RGVBIA Bull Gain Test and Heifer Development Program

The 25th Annual RGVBIA Bull Gain Test and Heifer Development Program ran from October 2022 to February 2023. Bulls and heifers were fed a concentrated feed ration for 112 days. Bulls were measured for average daily gain, scrotal circumference, hip height, and sonogrammed by a technician for a marbling and ribeye area. **We tested 80 bulls and 20 heifers at this event.** There were 27 consigning ranchers that participated in the gain test. Participants were able to identify their top performing bulls that will help them market or keep the best animals that they produce.





<u>Gardening</u>

This quarter sprouted **4 new gardens** at ARISE Hargill and Las Milpas, Bowie Educational Center and Sharyland Elementary! A total of **625 youth** participated in the Learn, Grow, Eat, Go (LGEG) program with 124 children participating in the Early Childhood LGEG program. More than 1,200 seedlings were distributed to 12 community gardens and 11 school gardens for the spring season.
