

NO refunds for cancellation shall be made after June 7, 2024.

<u>Safety Meetings</u>: Squad level safety meetings will be held for each squad shooting trap and skeet on Friday ONLY. Mandatory safety meetings will be held at both locations (Bandera Gun Club and Meier Field) at 8:00am on Saturday and wristbands will be presented. You will NOT be allowed to shoot if you do not have a wristband. Competition will begin at 9:00am.

- Hosting Period: July 24 August 17, 2024
 Host a youth aged 12-18 (majority are 12-14)
 - You must have a child of the same gender 8 within 3 yrs. of age of the hosted youth.
 (Children aged 9+ are eligible to host)
 - Families without children of the appropriate age may host an adult

- This is a voluntary program; no stipends will be


